#### PASTOR'S REPORT

To say that 2023 was a year of revitalization and renewal for our congregation would be an understatement. The energy of our new pastoral relationship in late 2022 fueled remarkable growth for our church. I might even go so far as to say that 2023 was our come back year!

There's more to growth and revitalization than numbers, but the numbers matter. Though we saw the death of 7 members, the removal of 7 members, and the transfer out of 4 members, we brought in 16 new members by transfer and profession of faith. We also celebrated one infant baptism. Worship attendance also soared to numbers not seen since well before the pandemic. Even a conservative estimate indicates an increased worship attendance of 50%! Though finances could've been better, our budget deficit was over \$25,000 less than projected at the beginning of 2023. All of these numbers tell the story of a congregation being renewed.

However, I prefer qualitative data to quantitative data. Numbers are nice, but the stories of our renewal are what really inspire me. Specifically, there are three areas I want to highlight.

First, we've seen an increase in missional engagement thanks to the good work of our IMPJ (Interpreting Mission, Peace, and Justice) committee. While IMPJ is responsible for funds distribution, they also have a responsibility for developing relationships with the community around the church. Members of the committee and others in the church have invested in a new relationship with an after-school program at the Sankofa Center in our neighborhood. Hearing stories of how our members are connecting with these children and how the children are benefiting from this relationship is truly inspiring. We also continue to provide food every Friday to those staying at Dover Interfaith Mission for Housing. Additionally, our own Heather Thomson joined others from our presbytery for a mission trip to the Congo in May. In 2024, this important work of building missional relationships will continue and, no doubt, increase.

Second, we've seen a tremendous amount of participation in the study of scripture and matters of faith. I offered six short term study options with topics ranging from joy and humor to Reformed theology and navigating a weary world. One of those six studies was our first adult Bible school where we enjoyed fellowship, food, fun, and a study of the parables of Jesus. Additionally, we provided sacred space for talking about death and dying from a Christian perspective this fall. We have several exciting studies already planned for 2024!

Third, we've seen a renewed commitment to exciting, innovative, and relevant worship. There's no greater compliment for a pastor than to hear that people are excited to come together to worship God on Sunday morning. Not only are attendance numbers up substantially, but the spirit of worship is also invigorating! We sing with gusto, pray without purpose, and wrestle with scripture in ways that truly leave us changed.

I couldn't be more thrilled to be your pastor and to lead us in this time of renewal and revitalization! We've been so incredibly blessed by God this year. I pray that we take notice of what God is doing in our midst and give God our thanks and praise. As wonderful as 2023 has been, I can't help but believe that 2024 will be even greater as we keep listening for God's call and following in the way of Christ by the power of the Spirit!

#### ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

The Administration Committee is responsible for the financial and personnel management of The Presbyterian Church of Dover. We are also responsible for recommending amendments to the church's Operations Manual and considering ways to improve operations, where required.

During 2023 we met monthly, and reports were received from our Treasurer, relative to the status of our budget and investments. This information assisted us in developing the estimated 2024 budget. We began the year with an estimated shortfall and concluded it with a \$34,772 deficit. This deficit was covered by transfers, during the year from our Merrill Lynch investment Account.

Mark Douyard returned to chair the Stewardship Campaign and recommended our participation in The Kaleidoscope Stewardship Conference, from September 25-27, in Minneapolis, Minnesota, to assist us in developing a short and long-term plan in our Stewardship Program and learn how to provide more information to our congregation about our finances in positive ways that might encourage their additional giving of time, talent, and treasure. Mark, Pastor Mark and I received scholarships for the conference entrance fees, workshops, dinners, and lunches. We attended, after Session approved our recommendation, supporting expenses for housing, transportation, and other incidentals. The conference proved to be inciteful and helped us to consider additional approaches to achieving successful Stewardship efforts. As a result, the Stewardship Generosity Campaign began October 8 and ended November 5, with the theme "Oh, The Places We Will Go." Letters with a narrative budget and pledge card were mailed to the congregation in mid-October, and moments for mission were presented by congregants on why they participate in the stewardship of the church. Stewardship messages were preached from the pulpit weekly. We experienced an increase of nearly 20% in pledges (62 or 10 more) over the previous year for \$230,541. Letters of appreciation were mailed to responders and reminders to non-responders were sent also. Our Stewardship efforts are ongoing and will continue throughout the year.

Personnel issues were wonderful until Heather Hamilton gave us notification of her leaving, December 24<sup>th</sup> to accept a new position closer to home. Steps were taken, immediately, to notify journals that publish openings for Music Director/Organist. Pastor Mark has assured us that we will be covered in our music until the appropriate musician is found.

Karin and her fellow website team did a wonderful job getting our website functional and it is quite an improvement over its predecessor.

I am, once again thankful that God showered us with the Holy Spirit throughout our zoom gatherings and for the wonderful contributions by members of this committee, Evelyn Schlauch, Deb Stuck, Dave Denny, Gary Patterson, Mark Douyard, Tom Mehl, William Whitham, Anthony Pietracatella, and incoming chair Karin Faulhaber. Thanks also to Pastor Mark for his prayers and contributions during the year.

# INVESTMENTS COMMITTEE (SUB-COMMITTEE OF ADMINISTRATION)

This Committee is responsible for the unbudgeted cash in the church's various funds, including the General Fund and the Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund. Merrill Lynch holds and invests the cash in a single investment portfolio. The Committee oversees this process. Scott Connell is the Merrill Lynch financial advisor who meets with the Committee.

The Portfolio beginning balance on January 1, 2023, was \$410,066. The Portfolio ending balance on December 31, 2023, was \$365,205.

The investment account had a gain of \$10,139 for 2023.

During 2023, \$55,000 was transferred from the investment account to the Church checking account to offset the 2023 Church Operating Budget deficit.

In 2023, the Investment Committee met several times with Scott, and the Church Treasurer Dave Denny communicated via telephone and email periodically with him throughout the year.

# PERSONNEL COMMITTEE (SUB-COMMITTEE OF ADMINISTRATION)

The mission of the Personnel Committee is to assist the Session and Pastor in the management of church staff. Primary activities of the committee include:

- Review and revise staff position descriptions
- Management of hiring process for new staff
- Conducting annual approval of staff review by Pastor (Head of Staff)
- Conducting exit interviews with departing staff as necessary
- Assisting pastor in any decisions regarding overall management of staff where committee input is required
- Assisting the Church Treasurer and Administration Committee with annual salary raises and other compensation adjustments.
- The year 2023, a year of major changes in the Church. A new Pastor completing a year of innovative preaching with an uptick of new members and gaining solid footholds in the Church.
- Organist and Music Director

We have had a few earthquakes this year with the loss of our Director of Music and Organist with her final performance and direction in December of 2023. We are engaged once again in the arduous process of finding the "needle in the haystack" once again. This will entail an extensive search with advertisement, including with the American Guild of Organists.

#### CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The Christian Education began the year with an open-ended brainstorming session, coming up with more exciting ideas than could possibly be done in a year. It was a starting point and started the year with enthusiasm. We talked about young adults, short series, faith-filled aging, community service, youth, Westminster Village, Murphy School, devotional guides, and summer events, to name a few. From there, we got down to work.

For children, we began by simply re-opening our nursery and built from there. The nursery is staffed by volunteers with each person signed up for one Sunday each month. The first staffing of the nursery was actually on Christmas Eve 2022 and it has been staffed each Sunday since then. We have ranged from 1 to 10 children each week. The next step was to invest in a Children's Bulletin program, with bulletins and materials provided for children in church each Sunday. However, we still wanted to do more. We wanted to begin to teach our children the stories of the Bible. The fall church season began with telling the story of Moses, from his birth through the Exodus and to his death. Each lesson included a story followed by an activity reinforcing the story. The children have really seemed to enjoy learning the stories and doing the

hands-on activities. The year culminated with lessons during Advent that matched the congregation-wide theme of "How Does a Weary World Rejoice?" and the making of holiday ornaments related to weekly themes.

On August 27, Back-to-School Sunday, students and teachers in education were sent off with blessings for the coming year. This included hand-made tags for each child or adult's backpack or carrying case.

For adults, Pastor Mark led a book study on *The Book of Joy: Lasting Happiness in a Changing World* by His Holiness the Dalai Lama, Desmond Tutu, and Douglas Abrams. The book celebrated our new beginnings as a congregation and pointed us in the direction of finding the joy to be had in our work as individuals and as a congregation.

For Lent, Pastor Mark led a study, Testimony: A Vocabulary of Faith. This study delved deeper into some of the key words of our faith and considered multiple aspects of their meaning for our lives today. Lenten devotional guides were provided to the congregation.

In May and June, Pastor Mark presented a 3-week study on humor in the Bible. Then, we geared up for the summer with the first Summer Adult Bible School. The theme for the summer study was the parables, based upon studies by Amy Jill Levine. It included lively discussions, games, and crafts. The program was a definite hit and was well attended with up to 30 participants during the week.

The Fall programming for adults started off strong with a 5-week course *The Last Dance, a series on Death and Dying.* The course included review of cultural views on death, legal aspects to be considered, grief and the grieving process, professional funeral services, and finally celebrating life within our Christian life. There were guest speakers and helpful handouts. There were an average of 26 participants each week.

In November, a short 3-week mini-series was run by Pastor Mark on Literature and Theology. Fifteen participants discussed 3 pieces of literature and how they might be interpreted and have meaning from a theological perspective.

The theme for Advent was church-wide, "How Does a Weary World Rejoice?" It included printed resources for use during worship, calendars and devotional guides made available for all members, children's calendars, and weekly studies. The weekly classes discussed the Biblical passages ahead of each week's service, with participants delving into how the Bible speaks to us time and time again even in the "busyness" and "wearyness" of our lives.

The Faith-Filled Aging adult group continues to provide a steady outlet for learning and friendship. They meet twice a month, skipping the cold winter months, but enjoying their time together the rest of the year. Studied discussions in 2023 related to aging from a Christian perspective and included the following books and videos: The Land of Jesus by Kathie Lee Gifford and Rabbi Jason Sobel and I Love Growing Older But I'll Never Grow Up by J Ellsworth Kalas.

Three Women's Circles met monthly for Bible study. A key theme for the year was based upon lessons from the book, Sacred Encounters: The Power and Presence of Jesus in Luke through Acts. The lessons cover incidents when ordinary people had life-changing encounters with Jesus. An underlying theme was discussions of how we can be like the women of the Bible, embracing our "aha" moments and encounters with Christ.

Adult programming across the board generally has used the hybrid model with both face-to-face sessions and Zoom. We have worked to improve our space, particularly the library, for learning and have established Zoom protocols to improve that functioning, particularly to allow small-group discussions even with those participating remotely.

As we look back on 2023, we are already looking ahead with enthusiasm for 2024.

#### PROPERTY COMMITTEE

The Property Committee had a successful year that saw us accomplish the following:

- 1. Steel storage shed (donated by John Murray) to be used for storage of outside equipment. Painted by him, delivered, and anchored in place.
- 2. Removed overgrown bushes and trees in front of church; applied several loads of black mulch to spruce up this area as part of "Church Yard Revitalization" project.
- 3. Purchased a new lawn mower and instituted a program for committee members to cut grass on a rotating schedule.
- 4. Phone lines replaced with new ones compatible with Wi-Fi (headed by Pastor Mark).
- 5. Replaced and/or added new security cameras around building.
- 6. Replaced "No Trespassing" signs with ones that are more inviting.
- 7. Fixed library ceiling light issues.
- 8. Replaced toilets in both Social Hall bathrooms.
- 9. Painted steps leading into Chancery (thanks to Gary Patterson).
- 10. Painted inner and outer offices (thanks to Julia Wheeler-Dean and helpers).
- 11. Mounted Fire Extinguishers and replaced some ceiling tiles in Social Hall.
- 12. Obtained and permanently mounted 2 outdoor trash cans.
- 13. Rear step railings (at double doors) repaired and painted; doors also painted.
- 14. Contracted with Fletchers HVAC for semi-annual service for all A/C units.
- 15. Social Hall floor cleaned, stripped, waxed, and burnished.

#### Ongoing Planned Projects:

- 1. Painting of Sanctuary is still delayed due to budgetary constraints (new quotes to be obtained).
- 2. Library upgrade is still delayed for the same reason.
- 3. Window-sill rot and insect damage in process of being repaired; nearly completed.
- 4. Rear steps (at double doors) in process of being repointed and sealed.
- 5. Bannisters (near Reed Street doors) in the process of being repaired and restained
- 6. The area behind the church (concrete top of kitchen pantry) has been sealed and painted and new asphalt installed; still an open item until no further leaks are found. Quote for sump pump in pantry to be obtained since it still leaks.
- 7. Diseased trees (2) in cemetery to be removed in spring.
- New bushes to be obtained and installed in spring as part of "Church Yard Revitalization" project.

The Cemetery Committee maintains the cemetery grounds, sells plots, and coordinates burials with local funeral homes.

The Cemetery is funded by the Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund. The Fund is managed by the Church Investment Committee. In addition, the John Clayton Trust provides funding for the Clayton Family grave site located in the Cemetery. The Committee is a subcommittee of the Church Property Committee.

Cemetery maintenance is contracted with Kent Landscaping. The contract calls for mowing/trimming/cleanup every two weeks April through November.

The Committee places US Flags on the graves of veterans for Memorial Day and Veterans Day.

In 2023 there were four burials and two standard size plots were sold.

#### INTERNAL AUDIT

The audit committee performed two audits for the 2023 calendar year. Records for 1/1/23-6/30/23 were reviewed on July 29, 2023, and records for 7/1/23-12/31/23 were reviewed on January 6, 2024. Treasurer Dave Denny provided bank statement copies and documentation for expenditures by month for the Citizens checking account and the Merrill Lynch investment account, which are the only two cash accounts held by the church. We cross-referenced the checks and debit transactions reported on the bank statements with the documentation authorizing those expenditures.

We confirmed beginning and ending balances of both the checking and investment accounts: ending cash balances at 12/31/23 provided in the Treasurer's 2023 Financial Report were confirmed with bank/investment statements. In addition, we confirmed all transfers between the two cash accounts.

We confirmed that quarterly payroll reports (941's) were filed and taxes were remitted for all 2023 quarters by reviewing the IRS EFTPS payment history report. We confirmed that we are reporting all wages and other payments in accordance with IRS regulations by reviewing Paychex payroll reports.

We reviewed all large-dollar transactions and cross-checked session minutes and other documentation for approval. In addition, expenditures were checked against bank statements to make sure amounts agreed.

Dave answered all questions and provided all documentation requested. We did not find any unapproved transactions or inappropriate spending. Procedures for church spending and documentation are being followed and records are being properly maintained and well-organized.
